Special camps for POWs of the Russian occupiers have opened in Ukraine.

The Russian military continues indiscriminate shelling of civilian targets, abducting people in **Sumy** and other temporarily occupied areas.

Russian troops fired more than 1,080 missiles into Ukraine.

The high-voltage line of the **Zaporizhzhya** NPP, damaged by the Russian military, has been restored.

In **Mariupol**, the Russian military destroys the Azovstal plant. The city suffered significant damage.

The Russian occupiers captured the secretary of the **Nova Kakhovka** city council, Dmitry Vasiliev, and detained him in a pre-trial detention center, using torture.

The situation in **Kyiv Oblast** remains critical. The northern areas of the right bank of the Dnieper are occupied, the town of **Slavutych** remains blocked. In Novy Petrivtsi near Kyiv, a landfill was set on fire, causing smog in the city. Fires are also burning in Gostomel, Bucha, and industrial sites. The air in the capital is currently very polluted, the concentration of harmful substances exceeds the norm by 33 times. In the village of Demidov, houses were flooded due to a destroyed dam. The dam was destroyed on February 26, which led to the filling of the river Irpin. An air strike was carried out in the town of Makariv, killing seven people, injuring five, destroying residential buildings and damaging an office building.

After the air strike in the **Zhytomyr** region, the grain warehouse of a private agricultural enterprise was destroyed and set on fire.

The city of **Mykolayiv** was shelled from the Kherson region.

There is evidence of mining in the Black Sea from the Bosphorus to Odessa.

As of the morning of March 19, 112 children had died in the fighting.
